### Notes From the Organ Bench by Ross Jallo, Director of Music Ministry

There are a few dedicated gardeners in the congregation at St Mark Lutheran, and I think it's fair to say that I am one of them. (It's always fascinating to compare gardens, especially considering that mine is sixty miles west of Davenport. Whose daffodils emerged first? Who's had enough rain to keep the tomatoes happy?) Growing things --whether it's horticulture or agriculture -- gives insight into a lot of Scripture, particularly the parables of Jesus: it's clear that he spoke in terms of fruit trees, vineyards, and seeds because his audience understood these things from daily experience.

There's a passage from the Gospel of John that is traditionally read on the Tuesday of Holy Week, in which Jesus, foreseeing his crucifixion, compares himself to a grain of wheat:

Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life."

One of my favorite Easter hymns is ELW #379, "Now the green blade rises", which is directly based on this passage from John:

Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, Wheat that in dark earth many days has lain; Love lives again, that with the dead has been; Love is come again like wheat arising green.

In his death on the cross and his resurrection -- the events we observe on Good Friday and Easter Sunday -- Jesus bore the fruit of redemption for all people. We are called to do the same, in a way: as Christians, we must daily die to self, so that we may produce much fruit. As a gardener, I am continually amazed that the backyard that was dead and brown in early March can burst into new green life by April. It's a reminder of the miracle of renewed life, where once was death. Nature gives us an example to follow: we are to practice resurrection.
